## *From The Minister...*

Grace and peace to you!

The weather is warming and the snow is melting! We may have some meteorological turbulence in the weeks ahead, including the possibility of yet more snow in March. Still, we are moving towards the warmth of spring!

Here at Lynnhurst, we are experiencing a little turbulence as we make our way towards the spring. Our administrative assistant Lisa Macklem has resigned so that she can accept a more full-time job at another congregation. Lisa has done tremendous work for us since her arrival four years ago. Though many of her efforts are behind-the-scenes, I can personally attest to the fact that our church would not have been running as smoothly as it has in recent years without her quiet, focused efforts. I will miss her, but I think I speak for all of us in saying that we wish her all the best in her new position at Edina Community Lutheran Church (ELCA).

In our spiritual life together, we are about to embark on our annual Lenten journey together. Whatever this Lent holds for us, both individually and as a people, I pray that we might deepen in faith, hope, and love in the days to come.

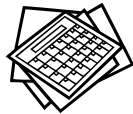
### **BENEFIT CONCERT FOR TRUST PARISH NURSE PROGRAM**

There will be a sign up for the potluck in the lounge following church each Sunday through March. Money raised from the event will go towards the International Institute of Minnesota.



### **THREE WAYS TO HELP OUR ONE WORLD FAMILY**

Men's Coats – THANK YOU for bringing in you gently used men's coats. So far we have collected and delivered 17 coats to the International Institute of Minnesota for refugees arriving in the Twin Cities during these cold winter months. We will continue to collect coats through the month of March with a goal of 20. Please drop them off on Sundays in the choir room or in the main office during the week.

Backpacks for School Age Children - THANK YOU for your donations of backpacks and school supplies. Our Sunday School students have already loaded 14 backpacks with needed school supplies. They will be delivered to the International Institute this week. Please keep those school supplies coming! Watch for a poster in the lounge showing what is still needed. Our goal is to deliver 40 backpacks.

#### Apartment Set Up and Mentoring

New refugee families are arriving every week. Volunteers are needed to help set up apartments. Apartment set up includes loading and transporting basic household supplies to the apartment site, grocery shopping, and putting furniture in place.

Mentoring is an opportunity to help a family adjust to life in Minnesota by meeting with them regularly over a 3 month period.
