FLU VACCINE CLINIC SCHEDULED FOR EARLY OCTOBER

TRUST, in partnership with the Minnesota Visiting Nurse Agency, will once again be sponsoring a flu shot clinic at Lynnhurst. Our clinic will be held on **Sunday, October 2nd**, from 11:15 a.m. to 12:15 p.m. Vaccine given now will provide protection through the full influenza season. Everyone 6 months of age and older should be vaccinated. In addition to the flu shot, an intranasal form is available for people ages 2-49, and a pneumonia vaccine is available for all adults 65 years of age and older and for anyone ages 2-64 who have a lowered resistance to infection. Bring your insurance cards (for Medicare, bring your Part B card), picture IDs and remember to wear short sleeves.



The following groups are especially important to receive vaccinations:

- * pregnant women
- * children younger than 2
- * adults 65 and older
- * people of any age with chronic medical conditions
- * people who live in a care facility
- * people who live with or care for people with high risk for complications from the flu, and those who live with or care for children less than 6 months old.

FAITH EXPLORATION

The group will meet at the church at 8:00 am, Saturday October 22nd, to discuss *Faith and Politics*, by John C. Danforth, former three-term Republican U.S. senator from Missouri and an ordained Episcopal priest. Danforth brings exceptional insight to the debate about the political use of religion and the separation of church and state. He worries that the Republican courting of the Christian Right is distorting all notions of public and private morality and violating the party's own long-held principles. Danforth urges more liberal and moderate Christians to challenge the presumption of the Christian Right in claiming to speak for all Christians. Rather than construct a political agenda based on narrow interpretations of religious orthodoxy, Christians should focus an expansive faith in God that embraces conflicting opinions on a range of controversial issues. All are welcome. A potluck breakfast always provides energy for discussion.

THE MUSIC AND ARTS BOARD PRESENTS

ARTISTS MICAH HELLING-CHRISTY AND MEGS MOLNAU

The Lynnhurst Music and Arts Board is pleased to present an exhibit of photographs by artists Micah Helling-Christy and Megs Molnau of Minnetonka, MN. Since meeting in college while pursuing their love for photography, Micah and Megs have been creating surreal photographs that challenge the way one views the world. Their show "Man vs. God" compares and contrasts Man's creations with God's creations. When these compositionally powerful photographs are seen side by side it opens the door to many philosophical questions, like why does God or Man create in the first place? The concept is intriguing, and when paired with the beautiful images it has a very captivating and dramatic effect on the viewer. Their dreamy, abstract landscapes are done through either in-camera manipulation or computer alterations. The same style is seen in their architectural photography, which also concentrates on dramatic shapes and lines. The exhibit will be on display in the Fellowship Hall Art Gallery from the evening of September 30th through November 30th.

The Montessori School that rents space in our lower level is expanding. The community has a need for more weekday space for Pre-School and Toddler students and LHMS wants to expand to fill some of this need. We have agreed to rent space in the upstairs Sunday School building to help them with this expansion in their student numbers. Monday-Friday they will be using the large gathering space (Assembly Room) for class and one of the Sunday School for lunch. They have purchased moveable equipment that will be stored in the Sunday School room when not in use. The children will use the bathroom adjacent to the small kitchen off our Pre-School room on the main floor. Lake Harriet Montessori will be responsible for cleaning up the areas they use on a daily basis and making sure that the space is ready for our other renters. We have entered into this trial partnership with LHMS in hopes that it will be a good expansion for both of us. 


